



Issues discussed in papers presented in this volume of Economic and Environmental Studies are focused on two main topics: conditions of living and agriculture sustainable development.

In the first group there are four articles. Babatunde Femi Akinyode, Musibau Omoakin Jelili and Olaitan Olutayo Odunola are writing about affordable housing in developing cities. Olawumi Daramola, Olufemi Adeleye, Hafeez Agbabiaka and Falilat Olowu present the influence of socioeconomic variability on housing quality standard. Rafiu Babatunde Ibrahim, Emmanuel Adigun Toyobo, Samuel Babatunde Adedotun and Sulaiman Yunus describe the public pipe-borne water supply system. Omotayo Ben Olugbamila, Samson Ajibola Adeyinka, Lucy Nkeiruka Ugwu, John Taiwo Famutimi and Odunwole Sogbon depict travel characteristics to healthcare facilities. All these articles are pertained with African territories and embedded in African realities.

Second group of articles concerns agriculture sustainable development issues. Karol Kociszewski describes theoretical aspects of sustainable development of agriculture and their implications. Monika Pawlita-Posmyk and Małgorzata Wzorek are focused on biogas production from the perspective of sustainable development. And finally Elżbieta Roszko-Wójtowicz and Maria Grzelak perform analysis of procurement of selected agricultural produce in Poland in the years 2010-2016.
